Peradeniya University Alumni Association in Victoria (PUAAViC) was founded in 2004 by a few enthusiastic alumni in Melbourne Victoria. Over the last fifteen years PUAAViC has come a long way from its humble beginnings to a well-established alumni organization with around 250 financial members and 400 alumni throughout Victoria.

As the outgoing president I am delighted to submit this annual report describing our activities throughout the year, and the financial statement for the year 2018 - 2019.

Being in the committee for last five years as the secretary for two terms, and the vice-president for one term, finally it was my turn to lead the PUAAViC committee for the year 2019. My sincere thanks are to everyone who encouraged me.

Other than attending to our regular annual events which are described in this annual report, this year we have been able to accomplish some other tasks that are vital to PUAAViC and for the community we belong to.

The other major achievement was establishing the "Pera Help Line" which is a brainchild of our young committee member Thusitha enabling PUAAViC to reach effectively towards young and needy PUAAViC alumni in Victoria. We all are aware that among us there are people who are resourceful and willing to help, and also there are newly arrived young alumni or alumni who may need desperately some assistance. I believe connecting these groups would be greatly beneficial towards the welfare of the PUAAViC community.

Few years ago PUAAViC instituted a decision of circulating member's requests that would be a benefit for our PUAAViC alumni though it adds more work for our secretarial subcommittee. This year responding to a PUAAViC member's request we circulated an email notifying interested alumni to donate towards medical expenses for Dr Jayalath Manorathne who is still in a critical condition. An amount of over \$3000 was received and sent for this purpose, and hope we all can be happy about our motive to help a veteran artist at a most needed time who helped PUAAViC previously in our fund raising activities.

On behalf of the Executive Committee 2019 I would like to thank Mr Sunil de Silva and Mr Ishara Wijesinghe for their voluntary work undertaking the external audit report for the year FY 2018.

I trust that we have successfully completed our annual calendar events to the satisfaction of PUAAViC members & alumni. This accomplishment wouldn't have been possible without the collective commitment of the executive committee members and subcommittee members. With a heartfelt gratitude I acknowledge their dedication to PUAAViC tasks this year.

6. Treasurer's Report

I hereby submit the Auditor's Report and the Financial Statement of the *PUAAViC* for the year ended 30 June 2019, comprising of;

Income & Expenditure Statement Balance Sheet.

As per the 2018-2019 Balance Sheet, the *PUAAViC* has assets valued at **\$56,679**. This includes \$34,389 in the Scholarships fund, \$2000 reserved for the Scholarships fund and \$2000 reserved for the ERFP fund.

The *PUAAViC* is in a stable financial position and is well placed to remain so into the future. The *PUAAViC*'s main sources of revenue are from the membership fees, Hantane Nite event, and Fathers Day Fundraiser for studentships and Educational Resources Funds. In addition for the current year PUAAViC has organized a musical event "Sakuna Wasanthaya for raise funds for the Disability Unit of Peradeniya University.

With the help of *PUAAViC* members, alumni and friends, our executive committee continued to improve on reserves with a surplus.

Independent Auditor's Report for the year ending 30 June 2019

To the Members,

Peradeniya University Alumni Australia - Victoria Chapter Inc. (PUAAViC)

Scope:

I have carried out an independent audit of the Financial Statements comprising a Statement of Asset and Liabilities (Balance Sheet) as at, and an Income and Expenditure Statement for the year ended, 30th June 2019 together with Notes thereto of Peradeniya University Alumni Australia – Victoria Chapter Inc. in order to express an opinion thereon to its Members.

The Committee of the Association is responsible for maintaining relevant records and the preparation of Financial Statements. Minutes of the AGM 2018

As scheduled PUAAViC AGM /2018 was held at St. Leonard's Church Hall 349 Springvale Road Glen Waverley VIC 3150 on 17th November 2018 at 3:00pm with 41 attendees.

President Sunil Ratnayake warmly welcomed attending members of PUAAViC to the AGM thanking for their participation. AGM was conducted as per the agenda.

Minutes of AGM 2017

Secretary Rohini Nilaweera read out the minutes of the previous AGM in 2017. Gamini de Alwis proposed and Gamini Hemachandra seconded that the minuets were in correct order.

Treasurers Report

Treasure Chamila Fernando presented the audited Financial Report for the year 2017/18 including the Income & Expenditure Statement and the Balance Sheet.

It was clarified that:

- As per the Balance Sheet 20117/2018, the PUAAViC has assets valued at \$49,563.00; this includes \$29,015.00 in the scholarship fund, \$2000.00 reserved for the scholarship funds and \$2000.00 reserved for ERFP fund.
- Total Scholarship fund has reached to \$33,992.00. Of that \$18,394.00 has now been deposited in a Fixed Deposit account.
- Hantane Night Fund Raising event 2017 Surplus was \$6720.00
- Membership fees collected is \$805.00
- Treasure further clarified the balance of accounts as of 30th June 2018.

Appointment of an external auditor

Treasurer Chamila Fernando mentioned that the Honorary Auditor Upul Premachandra will not be available for the next year, and a new Auditor should be appointed.

Accounting Package for managing PUAAViC accounts

Mangala Jayasinghe suggested that it is appropriate to have an accounting package for managing PUAAAViC accounts and AGM attendees were happy to leave it for the next committee.

Mangala Jayasinghe proposed and Harsha Jayasuriya seconded to adopt the Financial Report for the year 2017/18.

President's Report

President Sunil Ratnayake read out the President's report to the audience. He thanked the outgoing committee for the support given to him to complete a successful year. In addition, he specially thanked general members Upali Ileperuma, Koshala Rupassara, Prasanna Kalusinghe & Muditha Senanayake for their continuous support throughout the year.

Resolutions

There were four (3) general resolutions and four (4) special resolutions which had been duly circulated to members prior to the AGM.

General Resolution 1 was presented by Dr Kithsiri Dassanayake. The proposal is to establish a PUAAViC trust fund at the University of Peradeniya to manage the "Scholorship Fund". Kithsiri explained the contents of the resolution and members agreed in principle. Sunil Arachchi and Upali Ileperuma further expressed their views about benefits of setting up a trust fund.

The Resolution was approved at the AGM and it was decided to pass it to the next committee for necessary actions.

General Resolution 2 was presented by Mr Nirmalal Dias regarding a "Best Practice" approach in respect of recognizing those PUAAViC members who are no more with us specifically mentioning ex EXCO member Dr Basil de Silva. Nirmalal further explained how this could be done to mark the memory of deceased members through naming donations of ERFP programs. Members agreed his proposal.

The Resolution was approved at the AGM.

General Resolution 3 was presented by Dr Sunil Ratnayake and Mr Sunil Arachchi regarding a proposal to form PUAAViC social club subcommittees. Members concluded socialization is being done sufficiently within existing subcommittees.

Resolution was not passed at the AGM.

Special Resolutions were tabled as per in the AGM Notice.

Special Resolution 1 was presented by Mr Ajith de Silva, Mr Nirmalal Dias, & Mr. Renick Peries with regard to setting up a standing advisory panel to help manage perennial programs of PUAAViC.

Discussing the resolution Mangala Jayasinghe said that provisions have been made in rules for subcommittees to undertake all the work included in the resolution. Gamini Hemachandra said people can

volunteer in subcommittees. Gamini De Alwis explained that for any rule change exact wordings to be put forward. Ranjan Mendis said it will make a two tiered organization.

Resolution was not passed through the AGM.

Special Resolution 2 was presented by Dr Sunil Ratnayake which has given emphasis to

provide PUAAViC services for wider community in Sri Lanka.

Gamini Hemachandra explained there are about 500 organizations to cater for the wider community but PUAAViC is the only organization to cater for the Peradeniya student community. Upali proposed a vote for raising hand.

Resolution was not passed through the AGM.

Special Resolution 3 was proposed by Mr Sarath Jayasuriya to with regard to appoint an Advisory Council.

Members concluded that the contents were similar to the Special Resolution 1 decided not to discuss further.

The Resolution was not passed through the AGM.

Special Resolution 4 was proposed by Mr Sarath Jayasuriya stating that to be appointed to the committee, a member should have been registered as a member, at least for a minimum period of one year. Discussing this resolution Ranjith Gamage said to become an office bearer of the committee it is better to have a minimum of one year experience. Nimal Nilaweera explained this resolution has not formally drafted to be included in the rules.

Action to be taken by the next committee by informing Mr Sarath Jayasuriya to draft the resolution properly and re-submit.

Under any other business Mr. Tikiri Ranaweera proposed to allocate \$2000 to the scholarship/ studentship account, and \$2000 to Educational Resources Facilitation Program (ERFP) from the PUAAViC main account. The proposal was approved at the AGM. Members agreed to let the new committees to take actions on it.

Mr Ajith de Silva proposed to allocate \$4000 amount for the disabled unit of University Peradeniya for the expenses towards purchasing two motorized wheel chairs. The funds are from the proceeds of "Sakuna Wasanthaya" musical show. Mr Sunil Arachchi approved it. Members agreed with the proposal.

Next committee to allocate \$4000 to for program (ERFP) account from PUAAViC main fund from the profits of "Sakuna Wasanthaya" project.

Election of the committee members for year 2018/19

The secretary Rohini Nilaweera announced that there were only 13 nominations received to fill the 15 committee member vacancies.

President Sunil Ratnayake stepped down as the outgoing president and Gamini Hemachandra was nominated as the interim President and Rohini Nilaweera continued as the interim Secretary.

Following 13 members were appointed as the new Executive Committee of PUAAViC.
