Since the inauguration of the Peradeniya University Alumni Australia Victoria Chapter (PUAAViC) in 2004, we have been involved in supporting our alma mater, the University of Peradeniya in various ways with the generous participation of our current alumni members. In accordance with PUAAViC rules, notifying the Secretary's appointment to CAV was done with the submission of PUAAViC Annual Report and the Financial Report. CAV registration payments were made. The membership registry was maintained while ensuring the financial records were duly updated. Ten (10) life members and one (1) Annual member joined to PUAAViC this year. Also two (2) lapsed memberships were reinstated. A soft copy of membership registry has been updated. In 2016 it was decided that records of PUAAViC documents and correspondence should be maintained electronically.

We coordinated internal and external general correspondence of PUAAViC while saving copies in the secretary's mail folder. Information about various events and notices relevant to PUAAVIC alumni were circulated amongst alumni as received in the secretary's inbox.

We organized eight (8) committee meetings including an urgent meeting, as per the criteria specified in PUAAViC rules. Minutes of the committee meetings were duly documented, and records have been stored electronically in Secretary's email folder.

Yearly subscription was paid to Australia Post for securing the PUAAViC PO Box. Public Liability Insurance annual premium was paid for the year valid to January 2019.

The AGM 2018 notice was sent to PUAAViC members in accordance with PUAAViC rules.

In addition, it is the desire of PUAAVIC to financially assist high achieving students in their respective field of studies as an acknowledgement and encouragement of their achievements. PUAAVIC can only fulfil its mission by receiving generous support from our alumni community in Victoria and beyond. The support of our donor community goes a long way in helping PUAAViC to achieve its goals. Therefore, PUAAViC is indebted to all individuals who contributed to the PUAAViC Scholarship Programmes since 2012.

Interestingly, the Scholarship Program of PUAAViC was initiated in 2012 originally based on an idea by the sons and daughters of pioneering members of the Alumni, who having observed the dedication and commitment of their parents towards their alma mater, had thought of channeling the money they would



otherwise use for annual Father's Day presents, as a great way of returning their gratitude. The very first fund raising event was held on the Father's Day 2012 (2nd September 2012) and it has now become a tradition of the PUAAViC community to gather every Father's Day and contribute to a great cause while enjoying the day with their families and friends.

During the last few years, the scholarship programme has evolved into the largest community project of PUAAViC. Peradeniya Alumni community of Victoria must be very proud about its remarkable achievements in raising funds and contributions towards the University of Peradeniya students; thanks to the bigheartedness of our donors, PUAAVIC raised over \$90000 at annual Father's Day Fund raising events and distributed over \$60000 as scholarships/studentships to 493 needy and talented undergraduates in the last six (6) years since the commencement of the Scholarship Fund in 2012, as shown in Table 1.

Application & Selection Process

PUAAViC scholarship programme is administered through the Alumni Association, University of Peradeniya (AAUP), without whose dedicated support and commitment managing this programme so successfully is impossible.

The entire process of application and selection of potential recipients for PUAAViC scholarships is announced annually by the Scholarship Committees of each academic faculty of the university. Each applicant has to be endorsed by a member of permanent academic staff that he/she is in need and qualifies to apply for a studentship. PUAAViC has the final say on defining selection criteria for the selections. A certificate from the Grama Sewaka (local Village Headman) is required confirming that the household income of the applicant is below a defined standard. Each faculty scholarship committee consisting of members of academic staff and a representative of AAUP evaluates

and short-lists the potential awardees. As a general practice, Mahapola Scholarship recipients are not considered in the selection: Selection criteria for the selection of the recipients are based on the

household income, number of dependents and number of schooling children in the family. Once the final list of recipients is approved by PUAAViC, AAUP implement the fund disbursement process monthly. Awardees are required to sign a register maintained at AAUP before the payments are authorised by AAUP.

The PUAAVic scholarship programme assisted 21 undergraduates across all faculties during 2017/2018 funding cycle and the monthly allowance was raised Rs.3000.00. A similar number of students will be supported in the coming year.

As PUAAViC always does, it is currently in the process of further improving the scholarship programme through a consultative process with the broader membership, AAUP and the University Administration.

This year's celebration was the 7th consecutive time that the event has been held since its inception in 2012 by the children of PUAAViC parents living in Melbourne. It was encouraging and inspiring to observe the continuous involvement and support by the children to progress the Scholarship Support Program.

In collaboration with the Alumni Association of the University of Peradeniya (AAUP) in Sri Lanka, the Scholarship Support Program of the PUAAViC decided to grant scholarships to 21 needy students who were assisted in 2017 to continue in 2018 as well. Apart from granting scholarships and studentships, expanded scope in 2017 to provide educational resource facilities to needy faculties of the University will continue in 2018. An interview was telecasted one week prior to the event via Channel 31 informing the Sri Lankan community of the event as well as describing the objectives and evolvement of the Scholarship Program over the past six years.



This year's event primarily focused on providing opportunities for the young generation to present performances in a family friendly setting. There were two special inclusions this year: one was making arrangements for very young participants to create Fathers' Day greeting cards by themselves and presenting them at stage to respective fathers. This activity not only kept the young participants pleasantly occupied during the event but also it heightened their creative abilities. The other was a short documentary showcasing genuine appreciation and comments from

scholarship recipients in Sri Lanka. It was great to hear their stories in direct communication with them. In addition, the participants were treated to a number of signing performances mostly by the young generation based on themes related to Fathers' Day. The participants were treated to a complimentary delicious 'koththu roti' lunch. The event also entailed a presentation by coordinator of the subcommittee for Educational Resource Facilitation Program detailing the donation statistics over the past years.

The event assisted in contributing a net sum of approximately \$3,000 to the Scholarship Fund. The total expenditure for the event was approximately \$2,100. It was observed that the attendance at the event has gradually declined over the years. It was further observed there is a trend of declining amounts being contributed by usual donors as well. The post event analysis suggested to rethink of the event format going forward.



The event was very well supported by the subcommittee and the executive committee and of course immensely assisted by respective spouses in numerous ways. The front desk team did a wonderful job in making documentation of donations. Roshan Kurera's one-man band with his quality sound system provided fabulous music throughout the event. Special appreciation should be extended to Dulip Jayakody and Nilushini for undertaking the MC duties for the event.
