The tenth annual PUAAViC membership drive/Australia day event was held on 27th January 2020 at Heatherbrae Reserve, Officer with great success.

Ladies showed their colours once again by winning the Ladies Cricket match. In both Over Forty and Under Forty cricket matches Peradeniya teams grabbed the title.

## Scholarship / Studentship Programme 2020

Members are aware that we have been awarding scholarships to needy undergraduates since 2012 and so far, 526 scholarships have been awarded covering almost all faculties approximately to the tune Rs 8.6 million.

Last year our association decided to formalise this program through the Senate of the University with the concurrence of our parent body at Peradeniya. Accordingly, a sub committee was formed to implement the resolution adopted at the AGM. Our main objective was to formulate and regularise the Scholarship (Studentships) scheme through a legally binding framework in the form of a Trust, partnering with the University Senate.

A set of regulations were identified by the subcommittee for discussion and later, the most important were documented as Trust Rules and Regulations. By virtue of this process AAUPVIC became the Trustee. In simple terms, the procedure we followed from the inception has shifted from voluntary to statutory to award studentships. Significantly, the senate and NOT our parent body (AAUP) will be responsible for disbursements. However, all previous time-tested selection processes will remain unchanged.

Peradeniya University Senate on its sitting in February 2020, agreed to adopt the Trust Rules and Regulations drafted by us, for all future Studentship Awards. We are pleased to advise our membership that the Senate has forwarded the approved proposal to the University Grants Commission and onwards to the Department of External Resources of the Ministry of Finance for Government's Final approval. They have approved it in principle with the condition that AAUPVIC and Not the senate is to open the Bank account in Sri Lanka for this specific purpose.

Now we are at the initial stages of examining the Sri Lankan regulatory requirements to open a Trust Account. Amid the Covid-19 pandemic where every sphere is severely impacted, most work takes place in a slow rhythm. Once normalcy returns, rest assured, we will take prompt action to complete this task at hand.

The year 2020 has been tough on everyone, and as we watch the coronavirus pandemic play out on a global scale, it is easy to feel helpless. PUAAVIC was approached by individuals in Victoria as well as the Sri Lankan Consulate in Melbourne in search of possible support. As a leading organisation in

Victoria, we started the PUAAViC COVID-19 Support Program.

Objectives:

a) To liaise with various groups, organizations, individuals to identify affected individuals

b) To assess the needs of the individuals and prioritise them based on a set criteria.

c) To raise funds and seek other means of help through PUAAViC alumni and well-wishers.

This programme helped affected student visa holders of Sri Lankan origin and Peradeniya University alumni based in Victoria. We established the PUAAViC COVID-19 Support Program fund with the monetary contribution from the 2020 PUAAViC committee members and the PUAAViC members generously contributed to the fund (AUD 2,375.00) to help the people in need. We received numerous requests for support, and we provided monetary support to 15 students after a selection

process.

We wish to thank the committee, our members, Sri Lankan Consular office in Melbourne and the beneficiaries for believing in us to ask for support. We look forward to continuing our work together

on addressing similar community issues in the future.

## Lockdown Home Gardening Virtual Discussions

A series of virtual discussions were conducted using in-house knowledge and experience of personnel in the membership. Agriculture is one of the fields that our Alma Mater, University of Peradeniya, has produced experts and they came forward to expose their knowledge at a time when the State of Victoria was locked down due to COVID 19. This was a novel concept hitherto unexplored by any Sri Lankan community in Australia, using the zoom technology.

Four sessions were held fortnightly. All aspects of home gardening, involving land preparation, input use, pest and disease control and timing and management of planting were discussed. The participants were provided with ample opportunity to discuss with the resource personnel, their personal issues in the home garden and by the discussions that transpired and it was deemed that the participants benefitted from the virtual sessions.

I hereby submit the Auditor's Report and the Financial Statement of the PUAAViC for the year ended 30 June 2020, comprising of;

Income & Expenditure Statement

Balance Sheet.

As per the 2019-2020 Balance Sheet, the PUAAViC has assets valued at \$53,507. This includes \$38,277 in the Scholarships fund, \$8,931 ERFP account.

The PUAAViC is in a stable financial position and is well placed to remain so into the future. The PUAAViC's main sources of revenue are from the membership fees, Hantane Nite event, and Fathers Day Fundraiser for studentships and Educational Resources Funds. In this year we had to cancel most of our fundraising events due to coronavirus pandemic. We have implemented covid-19 support programme to help people in need & with the help of PUAAViC members & committee members we have collected \$2375.

With the help of PUAAViC members, alumni and friends, our executive committee continued to improve on reserves with a surplus.
